ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Ours is an institute with a history of nascent origin, however, moving with steadfast pace toward excellence and grafting its august presence in the national map of higher education and research.

Founded officially on 20th July, 2007, *Amdanga Jugal Kishore Mahavidyalaya* is the crest jewel of the people of Amdanga and adjoining area and an epitome of their dream and demand. The instate started its maiden journey with an extremely limited capacity with a five-roomed small one-storied building, 5 nos. of guest faculties, 2 nos. of casual non-teaching staff and just 57 nos. of enrolled students. With time it achieved a number of milestones and commendable success in developing an academic and administrative infrastructure, although a long way is yet left untraversed. Today the college is sprawled over 2 acres of land by the side of NH-34 with two spacious building – “*Kalam Bhavan*” and the newly built “*Bankim Bhavan*” with adequate number of state-of-the-art classrooms, offices, common rooms, gymnasium, modern washrooms and more than thousand students and above 30 numbers of fulltime teachers.

While climbing on its vision of disseminating knowledge and education that globalizes the self and liberates the soul, this institute fosters a lofty mission to contribute remarkably in nation-building by rearing up a community of pupil who are multi-skilled, law-abiding, environmentally conscious, and dutiful as well as to frame an economically viable future for all stakeholders.

The institute currently offers courses on arts stream only, both Honours (in Bengali, Education, English, History, Philosophy and Political Science) and General courses (in Arabic, Bengali, Education, English, History, Philosophy, Physical Education, Political Science and Sanskrit) at the UG level with accommodating capacity of more than twelve hundred students. CBCS curricula have been introduced in undergraduate courses from 2018. ICT enabled classrooms make learning both appealing and interesting. The Central Library of the College with a stock of more than four thousand books along with the adjoining Reading Room is one of the best of its kind.

Amdanga Jugal Kishore Mahavidyalaya, established in 2007, has come a long way in providing social and educational assistance mostly to the underprivileged section of the society. The college offers numerous facilities and is located advantageously over the National High Way (NH-34) which provides easy access to it. The College staff is dedicated towards bringing quality education to the village communities settled around this college.

Amdanga Jugal Kishore Mahavidyalaya used to be managed by a Preparatory Committee since its inception till 2015, when its first Governing body was formed, and I was fortunate enough to be selected its first President. Eligibility Criteria

A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:

- i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
- ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
- iii) 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all the other clauses are satisfied.

However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe Community taking up Honours Course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.

Guidelines for Admission

For the sake of maintaining transparency and by the regulation of West Bengal State University, the admission procedure for this college is conducted on merit basis and through online process.

About CBCS

Each semester under CBCS has a duration of six months in which class room session as well as examinations will have to be completed. Students will earn 1 credit per 15 hours, each class being of the duration of 1 hour. A course/paper consisting of 6 credits will carry a maximum of 75 marks of which written exam would constitute of 50 marks and 25 marks are allotted for internal markings.

In the 1st semester the students will study Environmental Science as compulsory subject and in the 2nd semester, one Modern Indian Language (Bengali) or English Communication Each subject carries a total of 2 credits. As SEC, Honours students will study 2 papers of one subject to be opted by the students from a pool of subjects. General students will study 4 SEC papers of either one subject in 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semesters or two subjects – one in 3rd and 4th semesters and the other in 5th and 6th semesters. Each paper consists of 2 credits.

Honours students will study a total 14 core courses. Each course carries a total of 6 credits. Honours students will also study 4 papers as DSE related to the core course subject. In addition to this, Honours students will choose any two subjects as Generic Elective(GE) from combination provided by college. Each subject in GE includes 2 papers. Each paper carries a total of 6 credits.

General students will study English as compulsory subject in 1st and 2nd semester. In 3rd and 4th semester, they will take up Bengali as compulsory subject. A total 6 credits is allotted for each compulsory language subject (LCC). Apart from these, General Course students will have to take up two subjects as DSC by the students. Each subject will have 4 papers. General students will study 2 subjects as DSE, related to core course. Each subject comprises of 2 papers. Each paper carries a total

GENERAL INFORMATION

ATTENDANCE

According to Choice Based Credit System 5 marks is allotted for attendance. For students it is mandatory to attend at least 75% of lectures failing which he or she will be declared as non collegiate (NC). These students have to pay a certain amount of fees (as determined by WBSU) in order to appear at University examinations. Students who fail to maintain at least 60% attendance will be declared as discollegiate (DC). These students will not be allowed to appear at University examinations.

COLLEGE EXAMINATION SYSTEM

At the end of each semester final examinations are conducted by WBSU. However during each semester students are prepared through several evaluation methods like formative evaluation, continuous internal assessments and internal assessment which are conducted by college teachers.

Facilities

The college offers multiple facilities to its students. These include ***smart class room, Seminar Hall***, a well-stocked ***digital library***, a ***modern gymnasium***, provisions for ***indoor/outdoor games***, ***refined drinking water*** as well as a ***pocket friendly canteen and free wifi zone***. These facilities encourage students to spend more time in the college and to make them feel at home.

Library

The college presently houses a sizeable library. Relevant academic books, as well as books pertaining to the interest of young learners are freely available to the pupils of the college. The collection of text books is quite diverse and expansive. There is a prompt and smoothly functioning system of borrowing and returning books from the library. New books are regularly purchased to keep abreast of developments in the curriculum. Irregular lending and returning of books are fined by the college. A complete digitization of the library as per “***KOHA***” norms. This will make the college library more accessible to the students. Further, the newly revamped library shall offer computer facilities for the students.

PUBLIC INFORMATION

Public Information

Amdanga Jugal Kishore Mahavidyalaya is a state-aided Higher Educational Institution affiliated under West Bengal State University and recognized by the 2(f) and the 12 B schedule of UGC. This Institution is Governed by the Governing Body of the college, formed as per West Bengal Universities and Colleges (Administration and Regulation) Act of 2017, and regulations and instructions issued from time to time by the Government of West Bengal, UGC and West Bengal State University. Being an abode of quality education, our institution is conscious of making ideal citizens. To meet this purpose the institution has designed several bodies/cells and programs that may contribute to social well-being through the training of the students. Governing Body of the college supervises the day-to-day functioning of the college through these various Committees, Councils and Cells which are the followings.

IQAC

To actualize the Vision and Mission of the college and to ensure quality in academic and cocurricular activities, an IQAC has been formed with internal and external members who are functioning together towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

- In the previous years IQAC has collaborated with various academic departments and administrative bodies of the college in organizing Seminars and workshops of academic and administrative nature.
- IQAC has also collaborated with other reputed Higher Educational Institutions in organizing Seminars and workshops of academic and administrative nature and Resource Sharing with some partner colleges.
- IQAC members have also been involved in organizing extension activities like tree planting health camps, awareness campaigns, excursions and cultural programmes both within and outside the campus.

Games & Sports

The college offers various facilities for sports activities such as footballs, cricket, badminton, volleyball, carom etc. Students are also encouraged to participate in university sports conducted every year by WBSU. The annual sports event is widely participated by the students of this college.

NSS

NSS UNIT-I has been established in 2017. guided by faculty staff, the NSS volunteers participate in various kinds of social work. campus cleaning, campaigning for health awareness and environmental protection are the diverse activities undertaken by the NSS volunteers, who are selected among the pupils of this college. The college is associated with numerous social welfare activities. As preparatory step to opening of an National Service Scheme Unit, this college organized

a Thalassaemia Camp. Recently, an NSS Unit has been opened in this college and is being managed under the supervision of faculty teachers. The college also hosts Health Camp every year for rendering free medical services. Medical attention for students can be obtained at minimum cost from Student's health Home , to which this college is securely attached.

Community Outreach

Community outreach programmes are regularly undertaken by this college to involve the students into activities that are social in nature. It is the intension of this college that the students should not remain confined to mere class rooms sessions, but they should engage themselves in community outreach. Community outreach programmes are aimed towards inculcating values within students and such programmes have two fold effect such as they help to foster social awareness in the pupils and also to foster aides to underprivileged communities. A bonding occurs between the institution and the community through the various outreach programmes planed each other. Among the various programmes undertaken recently by this college, Dengue Prevention Camp and Literacy awareness camp are notable.

Educational Tour

This college invokes educational tours for students. In some cases, educational tour is a part of the students curriculum. The college takes special care to involve students in excursion to historical places and to the locations rich in educational values. The Bengali, History, Political Science and Education Department of this college play key role in the organizing of such excursions. Through these outings students take part in activities beyond the classroom and they come back from the tours replete with valuable lessons of society and history.

Events

The college lays special emphasis on cultural activities which are held throughout the year. The college encourages overall participation of the students for organising cultural activities. The annual event of freshers Welcome is a major celebration undertaken in this college. The students show notable enthusiasm in organizing events like the 'VASA- DIBAS', Yoga Day, Independence Day and Republic Day celebration. The students display plenty of verve in commemorating the birth and death centenaries of famous Indian personalities and martyrs. The cultural events in this college are rightly viewed as occasions for mass bonding and social awareness. This college deems the participation of students in various events to be conducive to their holistic development. As such the college organizes various event to enable the students' opportunities for bonding and for extra-curricular activities. The college arranges for mass events like fresher's Welcome and the celebration of birth Centenaries of famous Indian Personalities. Apart from these, the college also make arrangements for community events which enable the students to engage in programmes for the benefit of the rural community. Among these, the students of this college can be found to participate in awareness campaigns and literary drives. Through the management of events students are cultivated in the role of leadership and universal fraternity. Hence the organization of events form an essential part of the year round activities undertaken in this college.

KANYASHREE SCHEME

Among the various welfare schemes sponsored by the Government of West Bengal, Kanyashree Prakalpa is a key project implemented in this college for the benefit of girl students who from the bulk of the student community of this college. At present three variants of the Kanyashree Scheme are being carried out. They are respectively designated as k1 & K2 and the purpose of including the students within these folds are to ensure that the poorer sections of the learners get the opportunity of higher education. Currently through the K1 & K2 Schemes Rs.750 and Rs.25000 are being respectively offered to the undergraduate students. A brief summary of the accomplishment of the K1 & K2 scheme are given below:
